

# **SUPERCROSS ESTONIAN CHAMPIONSHIP**

## **Regulations**

### Dates and Venues:

1. Definition and Title of Meeting.
    - 1.1 Supercross was derived from motocross and is one of the motocross disciplines. The tracks are usually normal motocross tracks, but shortened and they consist of steep jumps and obstacles which are artificially made for the supercross events. The tracks can also be made specially for the supercross events only and during night-time the tracks are illuminated (lightened). The competitions are held in the "drop-off system", which assure many shorts starts. The race ends with the final heat. The events are held usually during the midweek afternoons and/ or evening time. The meetings will be organized in conformation with the EMF general MX Rules and Regulations.
  2. Track.
    - 2.1 The length of the track.  
The length of the track should be made so the distance is passable for OPEN class in 50-60 seconds. The Motocross Commission has a right to change the distances of the track. The track must be in accordance with the Motocross Rules and Regulations.
    - 2.2 Track inspection.  
The organizer of the event must present to the Motocross Commission a drawing of circuit where the length of the track must be shown, also the elements on the track must be indicated. 1 (one) week before the meeting in question the Motocross Commission (or a person designated by the MX Commission) will make the track inspection and confirm the readiness of the track. After the track inspection the changes to the track can no longer be made. On the race day, in the morning the last track inspection will be made by the MX Commission (or a person designated by the MX Commission). The organizer must be prepared to make any changes to the track if necessary.
  3. Technical verification and classes.
    - 3.1 Motorcycles and classes.  
OPEN- up to 500cc 2 stroke/ 650cc 4 stroke (Juniors have separate scoring system)  
85cc- up to 85cc 2 stroke/ 150cc 4 stroke (65cc big wheels)  
All other conditions must be in accordance with the EMF and FIM Motocross Rules and Regulations.
  4. Starting numbers and number colors.
    - 4.1 Starting numbers.  
Starting numbers in use are the same which the MX Commission has issued for the riders for the 2010 MX Season.
    - 4.2 Number colors.  
Number colors and number plate colors are the same as described in the EMF MX Rules and Regulations.
    - 4.3 "Red Number Plate".  
The Red Number Plate is reserved for the previous year's Estonian Champion, who begins the new Supercross season with the Red Number Plate with white number 1 (one). During the Supercross season the Red Number Plate is used by the current leader of the Supercross series, the starting number is the same as allocated to the rider by the MX Commission for the running season. The winner of the previous Year has an opportunity to use # 1 for the whole season or he/she can use the number issued by the MX Commission.

5. Riders and registration.
  - 5.1 Age of riders.  
The age of a rider is in accordance with the EMF Motocross Rules and Regulations.
  - 5.2 Online registration will be available at [www.msport.ee](http://www.msport.ee) –website.
  - 5.3 Fees  
The participation fee is 500,- EEK to all participants (all classes) to be paid in cash during the registration.
  
6. Licences.
  - 6.1 All riders must have a valid National Motocross Rider's Licence issued by the EMF or any other FIM affiliated Federation or the FIM International Motocross Licence.
  
7. Timetables and system of race.
  - 7.1 Timetable.  
  
85cc- Free practice+ qualification 10 min+ 15min  
OPEN 1<sup>st</sup> Group- Free practice+ qualification 10 min+ 15min  
OPEN 2<sup>nd</sup> Group- Free practice+ qualification 10 min+ 15min  
85cc 1<sup>st</sup> Semifinal (odd numbers)- 10 laps  
85cc 2<sup>nd</sup> Semifinal (even numbers)- 10 laps  
OPEN 1<sup>st</sup> Semifinal (odd numbers)- 12 laps  
OPEN 2<sup>nd</sup> Semifinal (even numbers)- 12 laps  
85cc- B finals (positions from semifinal 11<sup>th</sup> and so on)  
OPEN- last chance 6 laps  
85cc- Final Heat  
OPEN- B finals (positions from semifinal 11<sup>th</sup> and so on)  
OPEN- Final Heat
  - 7.2 Practice and Races.  
Free practice and qualification race is joined together as one session. Free practice is 10min+qualification race 15min. After 10 min since the beginning of free practice the green flag is displayed at the finish line in order to show the beginning of a qualification race. After 25 min the finish flag is displayed to show the end of the free practice and qualification race.
  - 7.3 System of the race.  
The riders will be divided into the semifinal groups based on the qualification race results. The riders with odd number positions will be in the 1<sup>st</sup> group of the semifinals. The riders with the even number position will be in the 2<sup>nd</sup> group of the semifinals. Riders in positions 1-9 will get directly to the final heat and through the last chance 2 more riders get to the final. All other riders will have a B-final heat.
  
8. Scoring system.
  - 8.1 Points.  
The EMF MX1/MX2 scoring system applies- I place- 60, II- 53, III- 48, IV- 44, V- 41, VI- 40 ... 45<sup>th</sup> place- 1 point.
  - 8.2 Supercross Estonian Championship overall points and results.  
There will be 3-5 Supercross Estonian Championship Meetings. The accurate number of events will be published in the 2010 Estonian Championship (summer) MX calendar. All events are taken into account, no meeting will be deducted. The rider who gets the most points from all the races is the Supercross Estonian Champion. In case of a tie, the best result in the last event counts.
  
9. Prizes and prize giving ceremony.
  - 9.1 Prize giving ceremony.  
Prize giving ceremony takes place immediately after the final heats. Participation is compulsory for the positions 1-7 in OPEN class and for the positions 1-5 in 85cc class. If not attending the prize giving ceremony, the right for the prize will be abolished.
